The couple couldn't turn away from the hungry eyes peering out from the brush, so they did what kindhearted people do, they set out food and made sure every cat had a full belly each day. Their small act of compassion soon grew into a mission of love.

Before long, the visitors weren't just cats anymore, they were families. The two females had given birth, bringing seven tiny, vulnerable kittens into the world. Paul and Phyllis knew that without help; the situation could get out of control. That's when they turned to Neighborhood Cats Network.

Together, we sprang into action. The adult cats were humanely trapped, spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and returned to their familiar territory—ending the cycle of litters once and for all.

The seven kittens were brought into foster care, where gentle hands and patient hearts gave them the chance to grow up safe, socialized, and ready for adoption. Today, each of those kittens is on the path to finding a loving forever home.

But Paul and Phyllis didn't stop at rescue. Their compassion deepened. Wanting to give the remaining adults more than just a safe food source, they transformed their unused garage into a warm, welcoming sanctuary. With our help, they installed insulated cat cabins packed with straw, creating snug hideaways where their colony could sleep soundly through even the coldest winter nights.

What started as a couple of strays became a small, managed, thriving and cared-for colony—and it happened because two people opened their hearts and refused to look away.

Paul and Phyllis didn't just change the fate of these cats. They showed what's possible when compassion meets action:

#### Fostering Saves Lives: Selena and Her Seven Miracles



Life on the streets is brutal for any cat, but for a pregnant mom, it can be pure survival against impossible odds. No warm bed, no steady food, no safe place to give birth.

Every car that passes, every storm that rolls in, every lurking predator becomes a threat, not just to her, but to the tiny lives depending on her. Too many mother cats face this reality, and too many lose their battle before anyone ever knows they existed.

Selena was one of those mothers. By the time she crossed paths

with Neighborhood Cats Network, she had already endured multiple litters outdoors, her body worn down from the cycle of struggle and survival and very pregnant once again. She had known nothing but hardship, until everything changed.

That miracle was only possible because two incredible fosters, Meg and Dayna Corbett, said yes. They opened their spare bedroom and transformed it into a haven of hope. What could have been another tragic litter born to the streets became seven precious lives with a future, because Meg and Dayna made room in their home and their hearts.

Selena no longer had to choose between survival and motherhood. Instead, she could finally rest, purr, and care for her kittens with the peace every mother deserves. Watching her curl around her babies, safe at last, is a sight we will never forget.

#### Introducing the" Safe Haven Barn Cat Program"

At Neighborhood Cats Network, our mission has always been rooted in compassion, ensuring that community cats not only survive but truly thrive where they are. Through TNVRM (Trap, Neuter, Vaccinate, Return, Manage), along with daily feeding, care, and advocacy, we work tirelessly to give every cat the dignity and security they deserve.

We are honored to share the launch of our sixth program: **The Safe Haven Barn Cat Program**, which was created out of necessity and love. It joins our other five programs: TNVRM in Action, The Food Pantry, The Cat Cabin Project, The Education Initiative, and Journey to Forever Foster and Adoption.

While our goal is always to return cats to the place they know as home, we recognize that sometimes their environment is no longer safe. In heartbreaking situations, community cats face unrelenting dangers such as hostility from people, major construction or demolition, or the complete loss of their habitat. In these moments, staying is no longer an option.



The Safe Haven Barn Cat Program exists for these cats. It is a last-resort relocation program that gives feral and unsocialized cats a second chance at life when every other path is closed. We accept only a limited number of urgent cases each year, and each placement is handled with great care.


Cats in this program are placed in pre-approved barns and rural sanctuaries where they are welcomed not as strays, but as valued working cats. In their new homes, they are respected, provided with food, shelter, and veterinary care, and given the chance to live out their lives in safety.

Relocation is never taken lightly. Each case is reviewed thoroughly to ensure that it is absolutely necessary, and that the placement will provide the cat with long-term stability and security. We know the stress relocation can cause, which is why it is reserved only for those whose very survival depends on it.



At Neighborhood Cats Network, we hold to one unshakable truth: every cat deserves a haven. Whether that haven is the business park they patrol, the colony they cherish, or a barn that offers them sanctuary, we are committed to helping them find it.

The Safe Haven Barn Cat Program is our promise that no cat will ever be forgotten and no life will ever be dismissed as unworthy. For those who cannot remain where they are, we will open new doors that lead to safety, dignity, and the refuge they so deeply deserve.
